1. SCOPE

Employer's Objectives

The objective of the Employer is to appoint an experienced Service Provider to conduct Occupational Hygiene Surveys in terms of the Occupational Health and Safety Act & its associated Regulations.

1.1 DESCRIPTION

Johannesburg Water requires a service provider to conduct Hygiene Surveys assess the following stressors: (Asbestos, Noise, Ergonomics, Biological Hazards, Illumination, Ventilation and Thermal Stress)

The areas to be surveyed are:

- l) Klipspruit Depot
- m) Langlaagte Depot
- n) Olifantsvlei Works
- o) Southdale Depot





The Service Provider will also be required to interpret the results, compile a report and recommend control measures to ensure protection of the employees in the workplace.

2. REQUIREMENTS

2.1 The following standards specification must be met as required:

- Service provider must be registered with the Department of Labour as an AIA and must provide certification documents to validate such with a registration number. It is also highly recommended that the company also has the SANAS 17020:2012 accreditation.
- Equipment to be used for all measurements must be calibrated and SABS approved.

 Calibration certificates for all instruments to be used must be submitted.

2.2 KEY PERSONNEL

The key personnel for the project should meet the following criteria:

- Registered with SAIOH as Occupational Hygiene Technologist (x2)
- Have at least 3-4 years' experience in Occupational Hygiene;
- Have appropriate qualifications in Safety, Hygiene or Environmental Health / Management or Engineering field.

2.3 COMPANY'S EXPERIENCE

The Service Provider shall provide JW with at least 2 reference letters from Clients for work completed or in progress in relation to the scope of work. The reference letters, which should be on the Client's letterhead should give details of the following parameters:

- Scope of work,
- Duration,
- Quality of work





3. PROCEDURES

3.1 Noise

Specified maximum exposure limits for noise are provided in the Occupational Health and Safety Act (Act 85 of 1993). Employees who are exposed to noise rating levels higher than the specified limit (85 dBA for a continuous 8-hour exposure) are at risk of developing noise induced hearing loss.

- Service provider will be required to measure noise levels in identified areas as Noise zones
 or activities that produce high noise levels.
- Personal noise samples should also be taken on selected employees.

3.2 Ergonomics

An active on-site investigation of individual work processes should be conducted during which ergonomics:

- Manual materials handling, and lifting to and from heights
- Activities such as manhole entry, general work at treatment plants and networks, climbing up and down.
- Driving
- Office working arrangements chair, desk, laptop/ desktop interface.

Over and above this, the service provider will be requested to assess fatigue from employees, especially drivers and fieldworkers.

3.3 Biological hazards

Statutory requirement: The Occupational Health and Safety Act (Act 85 of 1993), section 8 (d) and the Regulations for Hazardous Biological Agents.

Service provider is to assess the extent of pathogenic micro-organism contamination on the hands of the workers engaged in typical activities within the sewer section of the Johannesburg Water and surfaces of areas that are required to be hygienic and free from pathogens (i.e Hygiene facilities and eating areas)





3.4 Illumination

Regulation 3(1) of the Environmental Regulations for Workplaces, Occupational Health and Safety Act No 85 of 1993 requires a Schedule of Minimum Average Values of Maintained illuminance for numerous workplaces. Measurements must also be conducted in accordance with SANS 10114:2004 – the National Standard for Interior Lighting.

 Illuminance measurements must be conducted during the daytime and nighttime hours, sampling work stations of all selected Johannesburg Water sites.

3.5 Ventilation & Air Sampling &

- Air Sampling: purpose of this survey is to assess the risk of employee exposure to airborne
 particulate contaminants when engaged in typical outdoor activities such as *manhole entry*.
- Ventilation: The purpose of this survey was to conduct an assessment of the Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) within the administrative office and production areas in Johannesburg Water facilities.


3.6 Thermal Stress

Service provider is required to assess selected thermal environments that the employees at Johannesburg Water are exposed to when engaged in outdoor and indoor activities. This will be done in order to:

- Allow for comparison of results to the relevant statutory requirements.
- Assess the risks which the thermal environments pose to worker health.
- Recommend any necessary remedial actions.

3.7 Asbestos

Service provider will be required to take samples to determine the level to which employees are exposed to asbestos using internationally approved methods.





4. Reports to be provided after Hygiene Survey

- Individual reports per site per survey should be sent to the Safety Manager for review before approval and signatures.
- Reports should be sent individually for ease of reference.
- Reports should be provided in hard copy and soft copy.
- Report must be signed by the Hygienist who conducted the hygiene survey.
- Must comprise of all the measured results and analyzed reports.
- Include certificates of key personnel and valid calibration certificates of equipment used.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
- Municipal Supply Regulation 38 (1) prescribes that a supply chain management policy must provide measures for the combating of abuse of the supply chain management system, and must enable the accounting officer, among others, to:
 - a. take all reasonable steps to prevent such abuse;
 - b. reject the bid of any bidder if that bidder or any of its directors has abused the supply chain management system of the municipality or municipal entity or has committed any improper conduct in relation to such system; and
 - c. cancel a contract awarded to a person if the person committed any corrupt or fraudulent act during the bidding process or the execution of the contract.

² Bid rigging (or collusive bidding) occurs when businesses, that would otherwise be expected to compete, secretly conspire to raise prices or lower the quality of goods and / or services for purchasers who wish to acquire goods and / or services through a bidding process. Bid rigging is, therefore, an agreement between competitors not to compete.

- 7. In particular, without limiting the generality of paragraphs 6 above, there has been no consultation, communication, agreement or arrangement with any competitor regarding:
 - (a) prices;
 - (b) geographical area where product or service will be rendered (market allocation)
 - (c) methods, factors or formulas used to calculate prices;
 - (d) the intention or decision to submit or not to submit, a bid;
 - (e) the submission of a bid which does not meet the specifications and conditions of the bid; or
 - (f) bidding with the intention not to win the bid.
- 8. In addition, there have been no consultations, communications, agreements or arrangements with any competitor regarding the quality, quantity, specifications and conditions or delivery particulars of the products or services to which this bid invitation relates.
- 9. The terms of the accompanying bid have not been, and will not be, disclosed by the bidder, directly or indirectly, to any competitor, prior to the date and time of the official bid opening or of the awarding of the contract.

³ Joint venture or Consortium means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract.

I am aware that, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided to combat any restrictive practices related to bids and contracts, bids that are suspicious will be reported to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties in terms of section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 of 1998 and or may be reported to the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) for criminal investigation and or may be restricted from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act No 12 of 2004 or any other applicable legislation.
