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#### 1. SCOPE OF WORK

Building maintenance at Helderkruin Depot.

#### 2. PURPOSE

The aim of the SHE specification is to ensure that any contractor which is appointed by Johannesburg Water to conduct any work complies with the SHE requirements of the SHE specification and any other legislative requirement applicable to the contract scope.

#### 3. APPLICABILITY

This document is applicable to all contractors and suppliers conducting contractual activities for and on behalf of Johannesburg Water.

#### 4. APPOINTMENTS

The contractor and its appointed sub-contractor must make the relevant legislative and non-statutory appointments, which must be maintained valid for the entire contract duration.

All appointees shall be suitably trained and found to be competent for the responsibilities there are assigned for.

Copies of all relevant appointments and the relevant competence certificates must be kept in the relevant SHE file.

## **5.INSURANCE**

The contractor and all its appointed sub-contractor(s) shall be registered with an appropriate compensation commissioner and have a valid letter of good standing from commissioner. The contractor is responsible for ensuring the Letter of Good Standing is valid for the entire duration of the project/contract. A copy of the letter of Good Standing must be kept in the SHE file.

#### **6.COSTING FOR SHE REQUIREMENTS**

The contractor is responsible for ensuring that SHE costing is taken into consideration for the entire project/contract as this will ensure they comply with the SHE legislative requirements

#### 7. INDUCTION

An initial induction shall be done with key personnel to familiarize them with the requirements on site and for compiling the SHE file.

Once labourers are appointed JW will conduct an induction on SHE requirements, and the contractor is also required to conduct their company specific induction



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#### 8. SUBMISSION OF SAFETY FILE

- Once appointed the contractor can submit their safety file for approval.
- Approval will be granted when the critical items have been sufficiently addressed.

#### 9. RISK ASSESSMENT

- Every Contractor who has been appointed contractually to conduct work for Johannesburg water shall do compile a baseline risk assessment prior to starting with work, subject to the approval of the Client.
- Thereafter the task based risk assessments will be done daily with every task being done.

#### 10. SAFE WORKING PROCEDURES / METHOD STATEMENTS

The following method statements / safe working procedures must be compiled:

- Incident investigation, emergency plan, waste management plan, PPE procedure, hand tool procedure, hazardous chemical substance procedure.
- Method statement for the entire works

#### 11. WORKING IN ELEVATED POSITIONS

No person shall be required or permitted to work in an elevated position unless such work is
performed safely from a ladder or scaffolding, or from a position where such person has been
made safe as if he were working from scaffolding.

#### 12.HOUSEKEEPING AND GENERAL SAFEGUARDING ON SITE

- The contractor must ensure that suitable housekeeping is continuously implemented on each construction site, including:
- the proper storage of materials and equipment.
- the removal of scrap, waste and debris at appropriate intervals;
- ensuring that materials required for use, are not placed on the site so as to obstruct.
- means of access to and egress from workplaces and passageways.
- ensuring that materials which are no longer required for use, do not accumulate on and are removed from the site at appropriate intervals.
- ensuring that waste and debris are not disposed of from a high place with a chute,
- unless the chute complies with the requirements
- ensuring that a catch platform or net is erected above an entrance or passageway.



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 or above a place where persons work or pass under, or fencing off the danger area if work is being performed above such entrance, passageway, or place so as to ensure that all persons are kept safe in the case of danger or possibility of persons being struck by falling objects

#### 13. SAFE USE OF LADDERS ON SITE

- An employee shall ensure that every ladder is constructed of sound material and is suitable
  for the purpose for which it is used, and is fitted with non-skid devices at the bottom ends and
  hooks or similar devices at the upper ends of the stiles which shall ensure the stability of the
  ladder during normal use; or is so lashed, held or secured whilst being used as to ensure the
  stability of the ladder under all conditions and at all times.
- No employer shall use a ladder, or permit it to be used, if it -has rungs fastened to the stiles
  only by means of nails, screws, spikes or in like manner; or has rungs which have not been
  properly let into the stiles: Provided that in the case of welded ladder or ladders of which the
  rungs are bolted or riveted to the stiles, the rungs need not be let into the sides; or has
  damaged stiles, or damaged or missing rungs
- No employer may permit that a ladder which is required to be leaned against an object for support be used which is longer than 9 m; and except with the approval of an inspector, the reach of a ladder be extended by fastening together two or more ladders: Provided that the provisions of this sub regulation shall not apply to extension of free-standing ladders.
- In the case of wooden ladders the employer shall ensure that the ladders are constructed of straight grained wood, free from defects, and with the grain running in the length of the stiles and rungs; and the ladders are not painted or covered in any manner, unless it has been established that there are no cracks or other inherent weaknesses: Provided that ladders may be treated with oil or covered with clear varnish or wood preservative.
- When work is done from a ladder, the employer shall take special precautionary measures to
  prevent articles from falling off; and provide suitable sheaths or receptacles in which hand
  tools shall be kept when not being used.
- An employer shall ensure that a fixed ladder which exceeds 5 m in length and is attached to a vertical structure with an inclination to the horizontal level of 75 or more, has its rungs at least 150 mm away from the structure to which the ladder is attached; and is provided with a cage which extends from a point not exceeding 2.5 m from the lower level to a height of at least



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900 mm above the top level served by the ladder; and shall afford firm support along its whole length for the back of the person climbing the ladder, and for which purpose no part of the cage shall be more than 700 mm away from the level of the rungs.

#### 14.ELECTRICAL CONTRACTOR & RESPONSIBLITIES

- No person may do electrical installation work as an electrical contractor unless that person has been registered as an electrical contractor in terms of the Regulation.
- The principal contractor who does electrical installation work as an electrical contractor shall
  register annually in the form of Annexure 3 with the chief inspector or a person appointed by
  the chief inspector. An application for registration shall be accompanied by a prescribed fee.
- An electrical contractor shall be responsible for the safety, safe use and maintenance of the electrical installation he or she uses or leases.

#### 15. WELDING, FLAME CUTTING, SOLDERING AND SIMILAR OPERATIONS

The principal contractor or user of machinery shall require or permit welding or flame cutting operations to be undertaken, unless

- The person operating the equipment has been fully instructed in the safe operation and use of such equipment and in the hazards which may arise from its use.
- Effective protection is provided and used for the eyes and respiratory system and, where necessary, for the face, hands, feet, legs, body, and clothing of persons performing such operations, as well as against heat, incandescent or flying particles or dangerous radiation.
- · Leads and electrode holders are effectively insulated; and
- The workplace is effectively partitioned off where practicable and where not practicable all other persons exposed to the hazards are warned and provided with suitable protective equipment.
- The principal contractor or user of machinery shall require or permit electric welding to be undertaken in wet or damp places, inside metal vessels or in contact with large masses of metal, unless—
- The insulation of the electrical leads is in a sound condition.
- The welder is completely insulated by means of boots, gloves or rubber mats; and
- The electrode holder is completely insulated to prevent accidental contact with currentcarrying parts.
- At least one other person who has been properly instructed to assist the welder in case of an emergency is and remains in attendance during operations: Provided that the provisions of



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this sub regulation shall not apply to a welding process where the maximum voltage to earth does not exceed 50 volts.

- The principal contractor or user of machinery shall require or permit welding, flame cutting, grinding, soldering or similar work to be undertaken in respect of any tube, tank, drum, vessel or similar object or container where such object or container
- Is completely closed, unless a rise in internal pressure cannot render it dangerous; or
- Contains any substance which, under the action of heat, may ignite or explode; or
  react to form dangerous or poisonous substances, unless a person who is competent to
  pronounce on the safety thereof has, after examination, certified in writing that any such
  danger has been removed by opening, ventilating or purging with water or steam, or by any
  other effective means.

#### 16.CONTROL OF EXPOSURE TO HAZARDOUS CHEMICAL AGENTS

- An employer must ensure that the exposure of an employee is either prevented or, where this
  is not reasonably practicable, adequately controlled: Provided that—
- Where there is exposure for which there is a restricted limit, the control of the exposure must be regarded as adequate if the level of exposure is below that limit or if the relevant area is zoned and the level of exposure is reduced to below that restricted limit by means of adequate personal protective equipment only after the level has been reduced to as low as is reasonably practicable by any other means than personal protective equipment; or
- Where there is exposure for which there is a maximum limit, the control of the exposure must be regarded as adequate if the exposure is at a level as low as is reasonably practicable below that maximum limit: Provided that in the case of temporary excursions above the control limit, the employer must ensure that the excursion is without a significant risk from exposure, the excursion is not indicative of a failure to maintain adequate control during the excursion and the area is temporarily demarcated.

#### 17.MEDICAL SCREENING REQUIREMENTS

- The contractor shall ensure that a medical surveillance programme is implemented for all employees.
- The medical examination shall be conducted in line with the employee job profile/job description.
- A valid medical fitness certificate must be submitted together with the SHE File for approval for all employees who will be doing work for Johannesburg Water.
- Any employee(s) who are declared conditionally fit must be provided with employment which does
  not aggravate their medical condition as to endanger themselves or other employees.
- The following tests shall be done:



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- o Audiograms.
- A cardio-respiratory examination
- Lung function tests.
- Eye/ sight tests.
- o A general physical examination.
- A review of previous medical history.
- Blood pressure tests
- Glucose tests
- Vaccinations (Hepatitis A & Typhoid)

#### 18.TOOLBOX TALKS

- The contractor shall ensure they conduct toolbox talks with their employees on a weekly basis and records of these must be kept in the SHE file.
- The objective of toolbox talks should be to communicate relevant site information to assist in improvement of occupational health and safety performance.
- Employees must acknowledge the receipt of toolbox talks and this record must also be kept in the SHE file.

#### 19. PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

- Contractor must issue their employees SABS approved PPE. A copy of the PPE issue register signed by the employee issued with the PPE must be kept in the SHE file.
- Contractor supervisor are required to conduct continuous inspections of the PPE issued to their
  employees to ensure that they are still in good condition to be used by the employee or they still
  comply with manufacture requirements.
- The contractor is responsible for ensuring that employees are trained on the safe use of the PPE issued to them, how to maintain it and the limitations of the PPE.
- NO SHORTS OR DRESSES WILL BE ALLOWED ON SITE

#### 20. WORKPLACE SIGNAGE

- Appropriate symbolic signage must be displayed where it is required by legislation.
- Appropriate warning, mandatory and information signs must be placed where required.
- All signs must comply to SANS/SABS requirements.
- Contractors shall use mandatory and prescribed symbolic safety signs at their lay down and site areas.



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## 21. INCIDENT REPORTING AND INVESTIGATION

- All incidents shall be reported to the Client before the end of the shift or within 24hrs of occurrence.
- Section 24 incidents shall be reported to DOL using the prescribed format.
- The contractor shall develop an incident management procedure and communicate with all employees.

#### 22. NOTIFICATION OF CONSTRUCTION WORK

• The contractor shall notify the DOL in the prescribed format of the intended work prior to work.

#### 23. COMPLIANCE MONITORING

• Weekly inspections and monthly audits will be conducted on site.

## 24. PROJECT COMPLETION

 Upon completion of the project the SHE file shall be returned to the Client for retention and close out.
