Bid rigging is, therefore, an agreement between competitors not to compete.

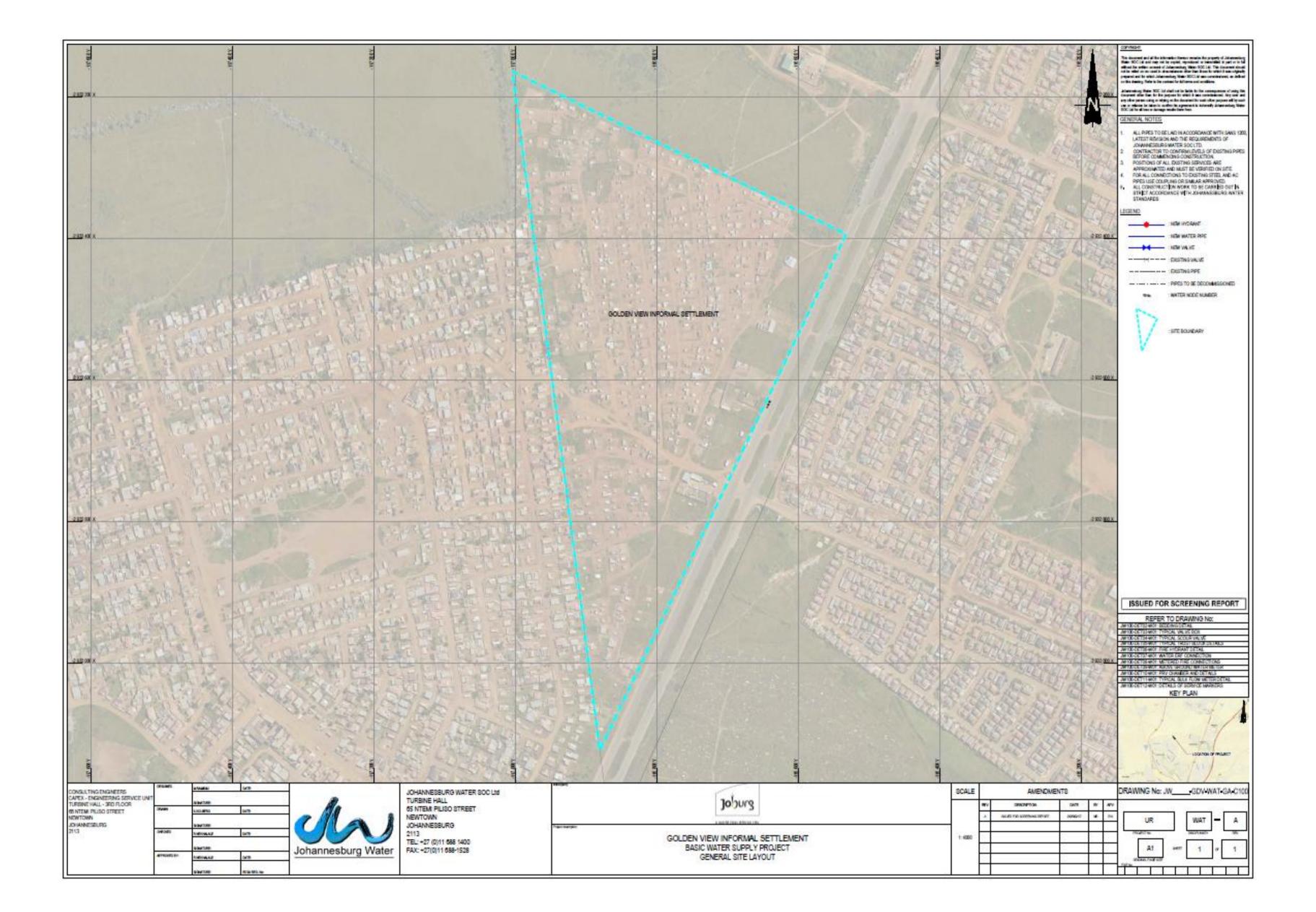

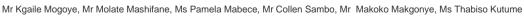
